ACUTUS MEDICAL, INC. CONFLICT MINERALS POLICY

Acutus Medical, Inc. (herein referred to as the "Company") is committed to ensuring full compliance with the Conflict Minerals Rules, drafted in response to section 1502 of the United States Dodd-Frank Act relating to conflict minerals.

The Conflict Minerals Rules are intended to address the situation in the mining industry in parts of the Democratic Republic of Congo ("DRC") and neighboring countries in Africa, where armed groups controlling local mines are using mining proceeds to fund regional conflicts. The conflict minerals law requires publicly traded companies, like the Company, to report to the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") and disclose on their website whether the defined "Conflict Minerals" – cassiterite (tin), wolframite (tungsten), columbite-tantalite (tantalum), and gold (collectively, also referred to as "3TG")– are necessary to the functionality or production of products they manufacture or contract to manufacture and, if so, whether those Conflict Minerals originate from conflict mines in the DRC or neighboring countries.

The Company is focused on sourcing product in a socially and environmentally responsible manner and we are committed to working with vendors that share our commitment to sourcing responsibly. To that end, the Company expects all vendors manufacturing our products to cooperate with our Conflict Minerals due diligence process. We further expect all vendors manufacturing our products to seek to use 3TGs from suppliers not involved in funding conflict in the DRC region.

The Company will follow the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development ("OECD") framework to incorporate proper due diligence measures into our supply chain regarding trade in Conflict Minerals. Given the complexity of our supply chain, we recognize we can successfully put this framework in place only with the full cooperation of our vendors. Accordingly, we are working closely with our vendors to determine the potential use of Conflict Minerals in our supply chain and conveying our expectation that they source such materials from socially responsible suppliers and smelters.

The Company takes its responsibilities under the Conflict Minerals Rules seriously and is working diligently to ensure full compliance.
